UK-trained doctors will need to have completed their early Specialty or Clinical training or have completed Senior House Officer training. Alternatively, they may have completed their GP training, or be able to demonstrate equivalent qualifications and experience of clinical practice in acute care of patients. Doctors who have trained outside of the UK will need to demonstrate equivalent qualifications and experience of clinical practice in acute care of patients.
